G3 2013 yielded almost 1300 Grizzlies, serving 2000+ hours on 59 projects. Projects included programs such as visiting senior centers, cleaning parks, caring for animals, packing cookies for U.S. Military Troops and many, many more.

Employees joined the Grizzlies in writing cards and packing boxes full of delicious cookies and sweets for troops deployed overseas. What began as a small kitchen project has grown into a nationwide network of committed volunteers that have sent over 3 million cookies to the troops. All one has to do is read a few of the thank you letters sent by grateful recipients to understand the giant impact a small gesture of appreciation can make. The Organization also accepts tax deductible monetary donations for those that want to contribute but aren't bakers.
